Travel: AIR: The closest airport is Syracuse Hancock International Airport, with direct flights from the three major airports in New York City, as well as Atlanta, Boston, Charlotte, Chicago-O'Hare, Cleveland, Detroit, Minneapolis, Orlando, Philadelphia, Toronto, and Washington DC, among other destinations. It is approximately 30 minutes from the airport to Cortland. Other nearby airports include Binghamton and Ithaca, both also about 30 minutes away. Rental cars are available at the airports; if you need transportation assistance from the airport please include that on your registration form.
